

Supply List

Just as most of us have a cupboard in our kitchen, bath... or both... containing a wide variety of useful -- though perhaps not often needed -- items, so it is that we should have a toolbox, tackle box or cupboard with items specifically for our alpacas and llamas. What is in the box or cupboard may vary from region to region such as items needed in treatment as the result of a poisonous snakebite or the use of BoSe or MuSe. You might consider to break your supplies into groupings: First Aid Kit, Cria Care Kit and General Supplies which would include items for progesterone testing and herd health maintenance. Many items are interchangeable and would be handy to include in each kit. Some items require refrigeration. Remember, the following is a **general** list of items useful in any region:

First Aid Kit:

- Vet wrap
- Ace Bandage
- Thermometer
- Stethoscope
- Lubricant
- Gauze rolls and pads
- Bandaging tape
- Various size syringes – generally 3cc to 20 cc
- Needles of varying sizes – generally 18 to 22
- Catheter tipped syringes – 60 cc
- Bulb syringe
- Charcoal (or other poisoning mediator)
- Mineral Oil
- Pepto Bismal
- Alcohol
- Hydrogen Peroxide
- Betadine Solution
- Antibiotic Ointment
- Saline Eyewash Solution
- Nitrofurazone Ointment
- Blood stop powder
- Epinephrine
- Penicillin
- Banamine
- Tweezers
- Scissors

- Disposable Gloves
- Disposable Razors
- Super Glue
- Emergency phone numbers
- Pen & Paper

Cria Care Kit:

- Thermometer
- Fleet Enema
- Nolvasan or other naval dip solution
- Film or pill canister (to hold dipping solution)
- Feeding Tube
- Feeding bottle
- Pritchard nipple or other
- Disposable Gloves
- Long Disposable Gloves
- Lubricant
- Bulb Syringe
- Dental Floss (for tying off umbilical if necessary)
- Stethoscope
- Weight Scale
- Milk Replacement Formula
- Cloth Towels
- Hair Blower
- Cria coats
- Emergency Phone Numbers

General Supplies:

- Oxygen Supply
- Colostrum
- Box of Disposable Gloves

- Heat Pad for Animals
- Blood Sample Vials and Cards (as needed for progesterone or DNA testing)

- Antibiotics (such as LA 200, Penicillin G, Naxel)
- Vitamins (such as Super B Complex, A&D)

- Skin Ointments (such as bag balm, antibiotic crème, zinc oxide)
- Eye Cleanser and Ointment
- Blood Stop Powder
- Super Glue
- Vet Wrap
- Fly Repellent
- Electrolyte Replacement
- Shears
- Nail Trimmers
- Halters
- Leads
- Scale
- Sun Block
- Flashlight and Batteries
- Bag of Sugar
- Plastic Tray
